**Background:**

In the event a previously issued aquaculture site is discontinued, the Department will conduct a performance review to determine if the site remains a suitable location for aquaculture. In such a case, the site will be added to the Registry of sites eligible for reallocation.

The registry of aquaculture sites eligible for reallocation contains details on the biophysical information related to the aquaculture site and can be found on the Department website at <https://novascotia.ca/fish/aquaculture/public-information/>

Following a competitive call for proposals, the aquaculture Administrator may select a proposal (with or without variations). A proponent whose proposal is selected has the exclusive right to apply for a new aquaculture licence and lease for a reallocated site, for a limited time.

Proposals will be accepted from 12:00 AM on the above Start Date to 11:59 PM on the above Deadline for Submissions Date.

**Evaluating and Decision:**

The criteria for selecting a proposal includes (but is not limited to):

- The technical and financial feasibility of the proposal
- The potential benefits to the community and Province;
- Any previous record of the proponent related to aquacultural operations; and
- The ability of the proponent to carry out the proposal.

Refer to the reallocation proposal form for more details on the criteria under consideration and how proposals are assessed.

The Aquaculture Administrator anticipates a decision on the call for proposals to be issued within 30 days following the deadline for submissions date, depending on the number of submissions received. The Administrator has the authority to select a proposal (as submitted or with variation) or to not select any proposals. The Administrator's decision will be posted on the department's website.

## **Site Description:**

### General Characteristics:

This site is located in the nearshore environment, in Upper South Cove of Lunenburg Bay, approximately 200m from the shoreline on both the Eastern and Western boundaries.

Records indicate mitigative measures should be considered to address the potential loss of product due to sea duck predation and the presence of invasive tunicates.

### Water Quality:

This site is located within an area classified as “approved” for harvesting of all species of bivalve mollusks by the Canadian Shellfish Sanitation Program as of November 30, 2023.

### Water Depth:

The most recent measurement indicated that the deepest portion of the site was 4.5m. Water depth should be confirmed by proponents at this site.

### Gear Present:

The Department is not aware of any aquaculture gear present at this site.

## **Site History:**

The previous licence and lease AQ#0041 was first issued in February, 2001. The previous licence was most recently renewed on May 3, 2016 for a ten-year term (March 4, 2016 to March 4, 2026) and the previous lease was most recently renewed on May 3, 2016 for a twenty-year term (March 4, 2016 to March 4, 2036).

This site was discontinued on March 23, 2018. A certificate of discharge has been issued to the former licence/lease holder pursuant to Section 62 of the *Aquaculture Licence and Lease Regulations*.

## **Performance Reviews Conducted by Administrator:**

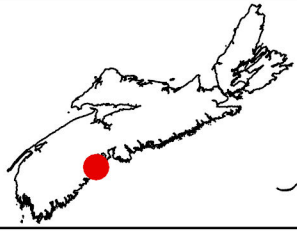
A performance review was conducted on the aquacultural operation of site AQ#0041, pursuant to Sections 71-72 of the *Aquaculture Licence and Lease Regulations* (the “Regulations”). Any concerns raised during the Performance Review have been added to the above site details.

Based on the performance review conducted above, AQ#0041 has been entered into the registry of aquaculture sites available for reallocation in the Province of Nova Scotia under Reference Number RE#9002.

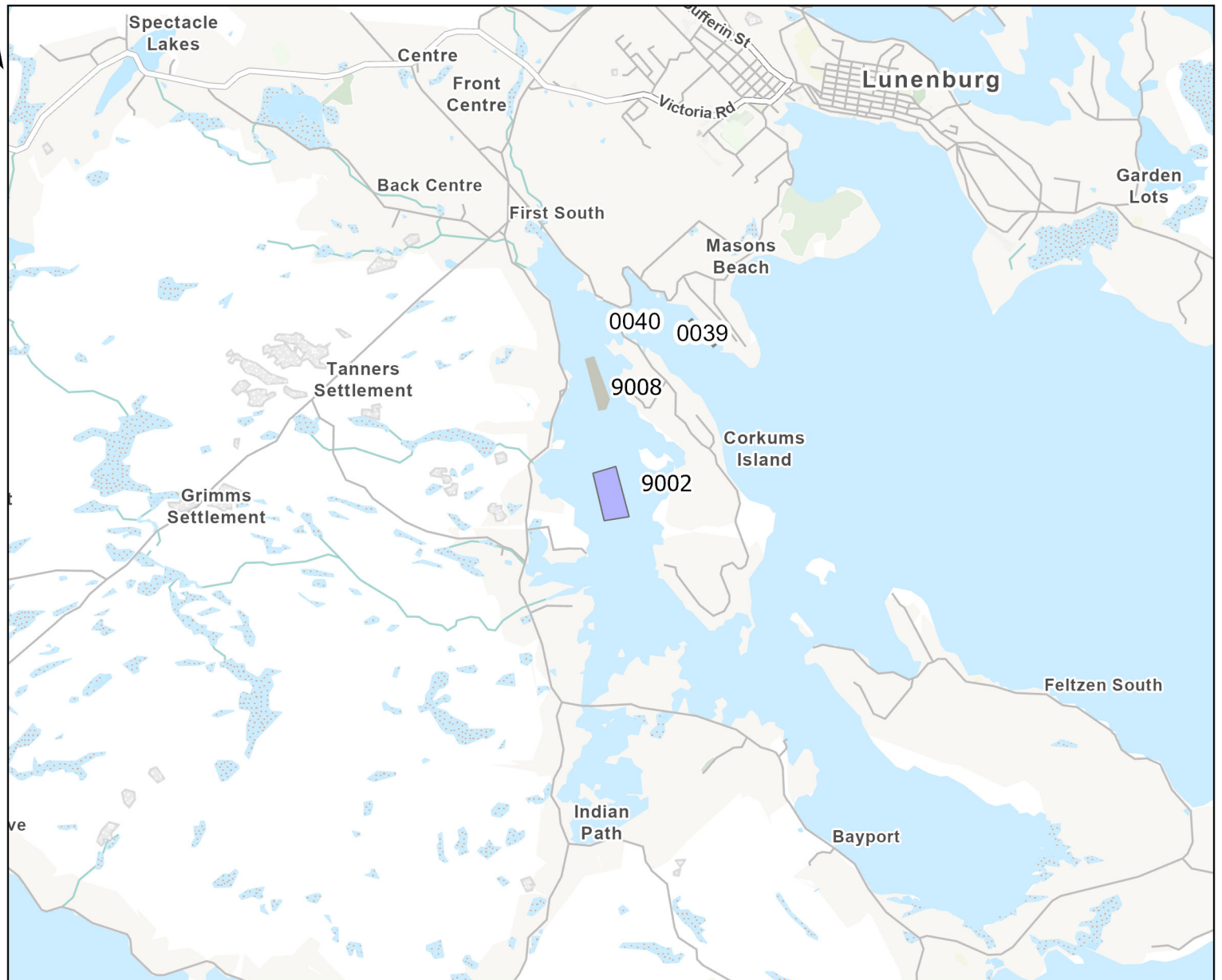

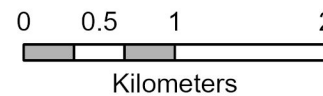

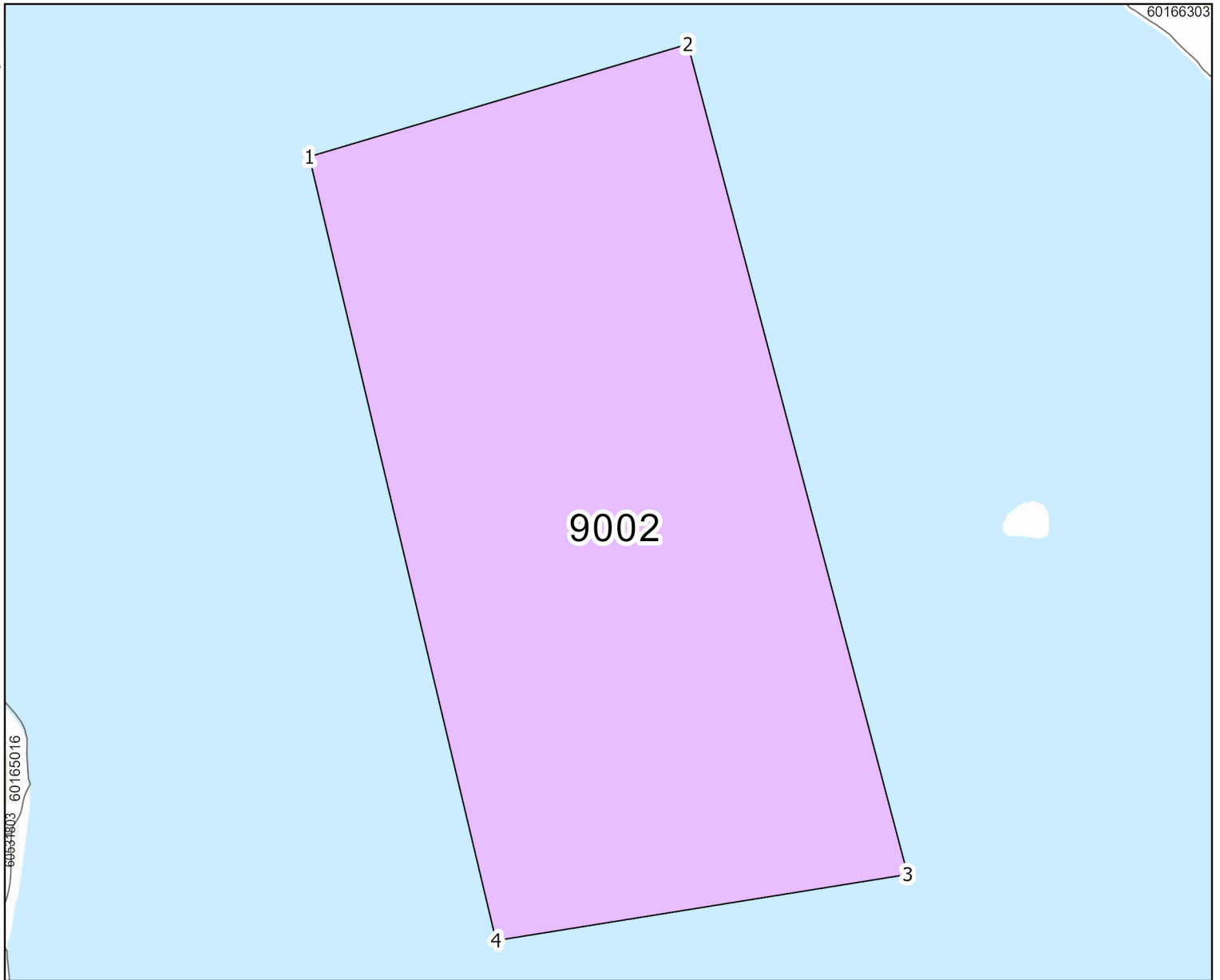

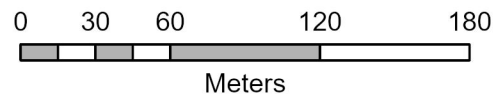
