ADULT CUSTODY

Teamwork defines your job as a Correctional Officer in adult offender correctional facilities. You and your fellow officers will be problem solving all day long. Your duties include admitting, supervising and discharging offenders—along with regular inspections and maintaining overall security. There will also be times in your shift when you'll be alone and have to act independently. This job calls for a mind that can quickly problem solve while staying calm and projecting confidence at all times.



YOUTH CUSTODY

As a Youth Worker you'll be involved in the care, custody and rehabilitation of youth in custody through a variety of programs and activities. The challenge is to engage and find common ground with the youth, which can happen in a group setting or on a one-on-one basis. There will be many challenges along the way, but your job is to remain patient and non-judgmental, developing and implementing case plans while constantly looking for opportunities to make a positive and lasting impact on a young life.



COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

A Probation Officer has two separate and distinct roles to play: as an officer of the court you'll prepare investigative reports for the court and supervise and enforce court ordered conditions on offenders placed on community supervision; all the while seeking solutions to assist offenders in turning their lives around. You will interact with offenders, victims, police and colleagues from the adult and youth correctional facilities on a regular basis. Your job is to be firm, fair and consistent while dealing with a wide variety of personalities.
