

IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD

AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, RYAN CURRY

AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal Code

DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 22nd day of November, 2011, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on two charges of assaulting a police officer, contrary to section 270(1)(a) of the Criminal Code; a charge of resisting a peace officer, contrary to section 129(a) of the Criminal Code; two charges of breach of probation, contrary to section 733.1 of the Criminal Code; and a charge of assault, contrary to section 266 of the Criminal Code; and on April 12th, 2012, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on a charge of assault, contrary to section 266 of the Criminal Code; and on the 19th day of November, 2015, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on a charge of assault contrary to section 266 of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital, although previously granted a conditional discharge;

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 24th day of January, 2017, to make an order pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

IT IS ORDERED that the conditional discharge previously granted be continued, on the following terms:

1. Keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
2. Maintain good mental health;
3. Adhere to the recommendations of the Community Mental Health Team;
4. Comply with follow-up by the Forensic Community Program;

5. Abstain from the use of alcohol and illicit drugs and comply with random urine drug screening;
6. Reside in premises approved by the East Coast Forensic Hospital and abide by the rules and regulations of the residence;
7. Notify the Board and the hospital of any change of address;
8. Appear before the Board when requested;
9. Remain within the province of Nova Scotia unless authorization in writing has been received from the Board.

The Board finds that the hospital was justified in restricting the liberties of the accused.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Services, Capital District Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to him pursuant to section 672.56(1) the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
