

**IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD
AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, FRANK GRAHAM FISHER
AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal
Code**

DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 4th day of April, 2013, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on the following charges: failure to comply with an undertaking, s. 145(2) – two counts – occurring December 16, 2012, in North Sydney; assaulting a police officer, s. 270(1)(a) occurring January 22, 2013, in Halifax; breach of probation, s. 733.1, occurring January 22, 2013, in Halifax; mischief, s. 430(4) (2 counts) occurring in Halifax on January 26, 2013; breach of undertaking, s. 145(3), occurring on January 26 in Halifax; and breach of probation, s. 733.1, occurring January 26 in Halifax;

AND WHEREAS the accused is currently detained in hospital although previously granted a conditional discharge;

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 7th day of March, 2017, to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED THAT the conditional discharge previously granted be continued, on the terms previously granted.

The Board finds that the hospital was justified in restricting the liberties of the accused.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Administrator of the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to him the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).
