## IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, CODEY HENNIGAR

AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held under section 672.82(1) of the Criminal Code

## DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2017, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on three counts of murder, contrary to section 235 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is currently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital with a ceiling of privileges of L2;

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2018, to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED that the accused continue to be detained in hospital with a ceiling of privileges of L4. Any unsupervised access is to be exercised only within the boundaries of the cities of Halifax and Dartmouth, and not in any rural area of the Halifax Regional Municipality. He is not to possess any weapons as defined in the Criminal Code. We also recommend that the imminent risk rating assessment be done on a weekly basis. The Board is also prepared to ban the initiation of contact with any individuals identified by the Crown by way of an addendum to this order if and when such a list is provided.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Services, Capital District Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to him pursuant to section 672.56(1) the authority to direct that the restrictions

on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
