

**IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD  
AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, MOHAMED ISSAK  
AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.81(1) and (2.1) of the  
*Criminal Code of Canada***

**DISPOSITION ORDER**

**WHEREAS** on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2016, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on charges of assault with a weapon, contrary to section 267(A) of the Criminal Code, and breach of probation, contrary to section 733.1 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is presently detained in hospital;

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2018, to make an order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Psychiatric Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition order or placement decision is made.

**IT IS ORDERED THAT** the conditional discharge previously granted be continued, on the following terms:

1. Keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
2. Maintain good mental health;
3. Adhere to the recommendations of the Community Mental Health Team;
4. Comply with follow up by the Forensic Community Program;
5. Comply with conditions recommended by the Forensic Community Program;
6. Abstain from the use of alcohol and illicit drugs and comply with random urine drug screening;
7. Reside in premises approved by the East Coast Forensic Hospital and abide by the rules and regulations of the residence;
8. Notify the Board and the East Coast Forensic Hospital of any change of address;
9. Appear before the Board when requested;
10. Remain within the province of Nova Scotia unless authorization in writing has been received from the Board.

The Board finds that the hospital was justified in restricting the liberties of the accused.

**THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU**, the Director, Mental Health Program, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to him authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberty of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out herein pursuant to section 672.56(1).
