

**IN THE MATTER OF the NOVA SCOTIA REVIEW BOARD**

**AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, MURRAY BRUCE MONK**

**AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.81 (2.1) of the Criminal Code**

**DISPOSITION ORDER**

**WHEREAS** on March 21, 2005, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on a charge of possession of a weapon, contrary to section 88 of the Criminal Code and a charge of causing a disturbance, contrary to section 175(1)(a)(1) of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital;

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2015, to make an order pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

**IT IS ORDERED THAT** the conditional discharge previously granted to the accused be continued, on the following terms:

1. Keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
2. Maintain good mental health;
3. Adhere to the recommendations of the Community Mental Health Team;
4. Comply with follow up by the Forensic Community Program;
5. Comply with conditions recommended by the Forensic Community Program;
6. Abstain from the use of alcohol and illicit drugs and comply with random urine drug screening;
7. Reside in premises approved by the East Coast Forensic Hospital and abide by the rules and regulations of the residence;
8. Notify the Review Board and the East Coast Forensic Hospital of any change of address;

9. Appear before the Board when requested;
10. Remain within the province of Nova Scotia unless authorization in writing has been received from the Board.

The Board finds that the hospital was justified in restricting the liberties of the accused.

**THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU**, the Administrator of the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to him pursuant to section 672.56(1) the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
