Disposition Order

Whereas on the 19th day of September, 2019, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of a mental disorder on a charge of assault with a weapon, contrary to section 267(a) of the Criminal Code of Canada;

And whereas the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital;


And whereas a hearing was held by Zoom conference at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 14th day of December, 2020, to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.54;

And whereas the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made.

It is ordered that the accused continue to be detained in the East Coast Forensic Hospital with L6 community access level.

This is therefore to command you, the administrator the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to the administrator, pursuant to section 672.56(1), the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberties of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits set out in this disposition.
