AND IN THE MATTER OF the accused, PETER MICHAEL SABOURIN

AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.68 of the Criminal Code

DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on the 12th day of June, 2015, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on charges of theft under \$5000, contrary to section 334(b) of the Criminal Code; possession of property obtained by crime, contrary to section 355 of the Criminal Code; (both charges relating to May 9th, 2014) theft under \$5,000, contrary to section 334(b) of the Criminal Code; possession of property obtained by crime, contrary to section 355 of the Criminal Code; (both charges relating to May 13th, 2014); robbery, contrary to section 344 of the Criminal Code (relating to May 19th, 2014).

AND WHEREAS the accused is presently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital under the terms of a disposition order issued after a hearing under Section 672.47;

AND WHEREAS the accused is a dual status offender as defined in Section 672.68 of the Criminal Code, by virtue of having been convicted of a series of offences on November 23rd, 2015, and sentenced to a term of 729 days imprisonment in a provincial institution;

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED THAT the accused be placed in the East Coast Forensic Hospital pursuant to Section 672.68(2) of the Criminal Code.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director, Mental Health Services, Nova Scotia Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this order. The Board delegates to him the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).
