AND IN THE MATTER OF a hearing held pursuant to section 672.47(1) of the Criminal Code

DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on November 14th, 2017, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on a charge of breach of recognizance, contrary to section 811 of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the accused is currently detained in hospital;

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 15th day of May, 2018, to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.54 of the Criminal Code;

AND WHEREAS the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED THAT the accused be discharged conditionally, on the following terms:

- 1. Keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
- 2. Maintain good mental health;
- 3. Adhere to the recommendations of the community mental health team;
- 4. Comply with follow up by the forensic community program;
- 5. Comply with conditions recommended by the forensic community program;
- 6. Abstain from the use of alcohol and illegal drugs and comply with random urine drug screening;
- 7. Notify the Board and the hospital of any change in address;
- 8. Appear before the Board when requested;
- 9. Remain within the province of Nova Scotia unless authorization in writing from the

Board has been obtained.

10. Reside in premises approved by the hospital.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Administrator of the East Coast Forensic Hospital, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order. The Board delegates to him the authority to increase or decrease the liberties of the accused pursuant to section 672.56(1).
