## DISPOSITION ORDER

WHEREAS on March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2013, the accused was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on three charges of assault with a weapon, contrary to section 267 of the Criminal Code; and on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2013, was found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder on one charge of assault, contrary to section 266 of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the accused is currently detained at the East Coast Forensic Hospital, having been transferred from the jurisdiction of the Quebec Review Board;

**AND WHEREAS** a hearing was held at the East Coast Forensic Hospital on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2015, to make a Disposition Order pursuant to section 672.81(2.1) of the Criminal Code;

**AND WHEREAS** the East Coast Forensic Hospital is designated for the custody, treatment or assessment of the accused, in respect of whom an assessment order, disposition or placement decision is made;

IT IS ORDERED that the accused continue to be detained in the East Coast Forensic Hospital with a ceiling of privileges of L6.

The Board finds that the hospital was justified in restricting the liberties of the accused.

THIS IS THEREFORE TO COMMAND YOU, the Director of the Mental Health Program, Capital District Health Authority, in Her Majesty's name, to execute the terms of this Order.

The Board delegates to him under section 672.56(1) the authority to direct that the restrictions on the liberty of the accused be increased or decreased within the limits and subject to the conditions set out in this order.
