

# Important information for currently certified individuals in the Watercourse Alteration Program: What's new in training and certification?

Updates to the *Activities Designation Regulations* came into effect on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 and prescribe watercourse alteration activities that require the involvement of certified Watercourse Alteration Sizers and/or Installers.

Additionally, a Watercourse Alteration Installer is required to conduct the work or directly supervise the work for watercourse alterations under an approval or notification.

## Individuals certified before October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 must recertify to continue watercourse alteration work in Nova Scotia

In order to continue doing watercourse alteration work in Nova Scotia, individuals certified before October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 must successfully complete the relevant and approved certification course(s) to become a Watercourse Alteration Sizer and/or Installer. The certification courses are provided by the Maritime College of Forest Technology. ### Certificates now to be updated every 10 years.

Certificates will expire in 10 years from the date they are issued, unless cancelled or suspended earlier. It is the responsibility of each individual to maintain their Sizer and/or Installer certification.
